Parents register with CHILD and keep the information up to date to participate in the program; applications returned by July 10th for Back to School and Nov. 1st for participation in the Christmas portion of the program.

The NBUMC Food Pantry is open Friday, Saturday, and Monday from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. and Wednesday from 2 p.m. to 6 p.m. for local residents and travelers needing help putting food on their table. Food is provided by the Tillamook Food Bank as well as donations from local businesses and individuals. In addition to the Food Pantry, the NBUMC also runs a small clothing bank on the same days as the Food Pantry.

Nehalem Senior Lunches are provided by the Nehalem Bay United Methodist Church. NBUMC offer meals to seniors every Tuesday and Thursday. A donation of \$5 per meal is requested. Meals are delivered to those who are unable to come to the church. Seating begins at 11:30 with lunch served at noon.

Columbia Pacific CCO is a coordinated care organization (CCO). Oregon's nonprofit CCOs provide health care coverage, but that's not all. We also support programs that create healthy communities by increasing access to fresh food and safe, affordable housing, promoting early literacy and trauma-informed care, and much more.

Who we serve: Every day, Columbia Pacific CCO helps more than 34,000 residents of Tillamook, Clatsop and Columbia counties access physical, dental and mental health care and prescription drug coverage through the Oregon Health Plan (OHP), Oregon's Medicaid program.

What we offer: Through our growing network of providers, we offer care and substance use treatment. We also offer these important services:

- Interpretation
- Transportation options
- Care coordination

Meals for Seniors, Inc.

Mission Statement: *Our mission is to enable the senior citizens of North Tillamook County to continue living independently in their own homes by providing access to nutritious meals and social occasions.*

OVERVIEW: Since 2003, Meals for Seniors, Inc. has been preparing, cooking, serving and delivering fresh, hot meals to senior citizens. We serve meals Monday, Wednesday and Friday at 11:30 am, 52 weeks of the year at the kitchen and dining facility at St. Mary by the Sea Church in Rockaway Beach. Between Garibaldi and Nehalem, we also deliver meals to home bound seniors. For the home bound we deliver 6 meals per week, plus snacks. For many of them, this is the only meal they may have on a given day. We are a volunteer managed and operated organization and funding for our program comes from donations and grants. In 2021 our volunteers donated 4,606 hours of their time and drove 6,708 miles to get hot meals delivered to our vulnerable homebound. In 2022 we are on track to prepare, serve or deliver 11,600 meals!

Mission Statement: North Coast Communities for Watershed Protection (NCCWP) is a grass-roots association of citizens from Rockaway Beach and surrounding communities. The group began in 2012 with the actions of one Rockaway citizen concerned about clear cutting for forestland and aerial spraying in the Jetty Creek Watershed - the sole source of her community's drinking water. The group now partners with neighboring communities facing air- and water-quality issues and with statewide organizations advocating for forest practices that will ensure clean air and water for all living beings.

Our goals are to educate citizens about the connection between forest practices and the quality of their air and water, to advocate for forest practices that will ensure clean air and water, to support communities working to protect their watershed, no more clearcutting and pesticide spraying in our drinking water sources, regardless of land ownership, as our watershed is rightfully part of the public trust.

Sign up to volunteer or simply come to our events or meetings! We are completely grassroots meaning we are just members of the community who individually decide to come together around this cause. Attend our meetings and education opportunities, help us with our petition and awareness campaign efforts, join our rallies and other events, help coordinate volunteers, help with social media, help with our citizen science efforts (including water turbidity testing), and campaign organizing.

(Formerly known as Rinehart Clinic & Pharmacy) Wheeler, Oregon

Mission Statement:

Delivering compassionate team-based health care and wellness education to improve the lives of ALL in our community.

About Nehalem Bay Health Center & Pharmacy:

Nehalem Bay Health Center & Pharmacy (formerly known as the Rinehart Clinic) is a non-profit Community Health Center on the North Oregon Coast that provides quality health care services to the entire community, regardless of a person's financial circumstances.

Nehalem Bay Health Center & Pharmacy is recognized by the Oregon Health Authority for its commitment to patient-centered care. Services include primary care for the whole family, naturopathic medicine, acupuncture, mental health counseling, well-child exams, women's health, immunizations, on-site lab services, addiction counseling, 24-hour on-call availability, patient transportation, and health insurance assistance. Several team members are bilingual (English/Spanish), and professional interpreter services are available for anyone who needs language assistance. The care team also offers wellness classes and activities that are free and open to the community. In addition, Nehalem Bay Health Center & Pharmacy operates the Neah-Kah-Nie (NKN) Student Health & Wellness Center, a school-based health center located at Neah-Kah-Nie High School that serves the students and staff of the NKN School District.

Nehalem Bay Health Center & Pharmacy accepts insurance, including the Oregon Health Plan, Medicare, and most private insurance plans. A sliding fee scale is available to all patients based on income, and as a Federally Qualified Health Center, there are programs available to help patients who may have difficulty paying their health care bills.

There is also an on-site pharmacy for the convenience of patients and the community. It is open to everyone (not just patients) and is the only retail pharmacy between Seaside and Tillamook.

The Board of Directors made the decision last year to change the name of the facility from Rinehart Clinic to Nehalem Bay Health Center & Pharmacy. Looking further into the future and the health center's place in the community, the organization's leadership has been in discussions with the Nehalem Bay Health District to plan an eventual new and expanded facility on property owned by the district in Wheeler.

As a non-profit Community Health Center, Nehalem Bay Health Center & Pharmacy depends on a variety of funding, including federal and other grants. The center is also grateful for the generosity of private donors who help offset the cost of providing services to those in our community who need care.

Sammy's Place began in 2006 with a modest vision to provide respite for those experiencing intellectual and/or developmental disabilities (I/DD) on the coast of Oregon. After recent strategic planning, the organization has realized the extensive lack of resources for individuals and families experiencing I/DD, on the coast. All of our work is based on the vision of creating a welcoming coastal region where *everybody*

has what they need to thrive. To achieve this, we are committed to modeling the concept of *Universal Access throughout our projects: Access so any individual may participate and enjoy an environment, product, or service independently, and ultimately enjoy a good life of our own choice.*

Sammy's Place, as the organization, has two primary areas of focus, the **Oregon COAST Network** [Communities of All Abilities Succeeding Together] that provides networking and community education, and the **Thompson Acres LLC** project, a focus on home ownership for everyone including those who experience I/DD to live alongside their peers.



In 2019 Sammy's Place acquired 3 acres of land several blocks from the downtown area of the small village of Nehalem on the Coast of Oregon. Close by is public transportation, a recreation/community center, shops, a small market, and public river access for recreation such as kayaking and fishing.



Today, the cleanup is complete with the major work conducted in partnership with the Oregon Dept. of Environmental Quality (DEQ), the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), funding from Business Oregon, and many volunteer hours.

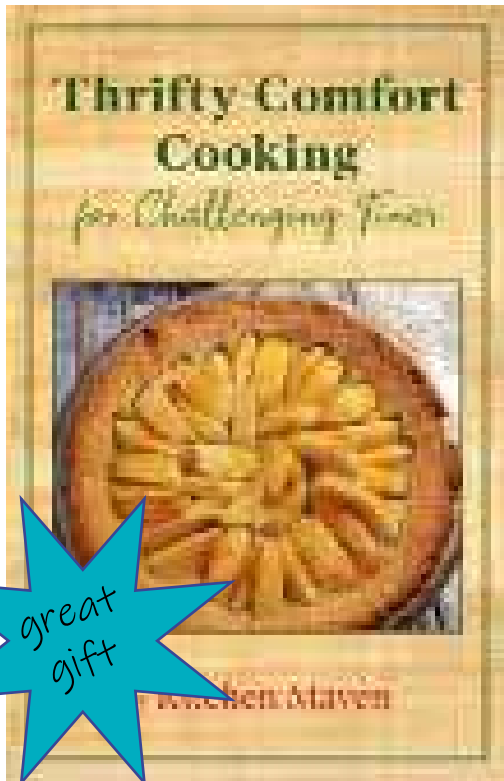

Thrifty Cooking for Challenging Times Kitchen Maven Cookbook

When the 2020 pandemic brought upheaval to everyone on the planet, Oregon grandmother, home chef, food writer, and Kitchen Maven Judi Berman-Yamada set to work writing her cookbook to benefit the Oregon Food Bank and her neighbors experiencing food insecurity. While creating her cookbook, Yamada began eating better (she lost forty pounds), moving more and improved her own health.

"This ongoing food shortage has become more crucial than ever as local hunger relief programs observed a 40% rise in food insecurity and the need for assistance during the pandemic, Access to nourishing food is difficult for countless people in rural, inner city and low-income communities. To maintain services for those affected by food insecurity, local Food Banks and other food relief agencies need continued aid. Whether we make donations, volunteer time, grow and distribute food, or even contribute a cookbook, we can all help." - Judi Berman-Yamada

Blueberry Bars

9-inch square baking pan, ungreased
½ cup unsalted butter, cut in about 16 small chunks
1 ¼ cups whole wheat pastry flour, measured by spooning method
½ cup granulated sugar
1-2 teaspoons finely grated lemon zest, yellow only
1 teaspoon corn starch, NOT corn flour
½ teaspoon salt *
¼ teaspoon baking powder
¼ teaspoon ground cardamom
1-3 teaspoons ice cold water
1 cup fresh washed blueberries, thoroughly dried
Preheat oven to 375 degrees F.
Freeze butter chunks for 15 minutes.
Combine all dry ingredients, including lemon zest; whisk well.

When limiting sugar in a recipe, I find that fruity desserts and treats are most forgiving and delicious. This one, which I adapted, both simplifies the process and increases the fiber. And they are really good. Fresh blueberries are readily available in supermarkets year-round and they're packed with nutrition. Try these tasty bars as part of a brunch, teatime treat, in lunch boxes or as part of your holiday presentation. They take just minutes to prepare and are probably one of the quickest easiest cookies I've ever baked. Enjoy!

Cut the frozen butter chunks into the dry ingredients until granules look like coarse sand with some small pea sized bits throughout. When butter is well incorporated, drizzle in the ice water. Mix well. Mixture should be just moist enough to hold together when squeezed between the fingers. Alternatively, put whisked dry ingredients into food processor along with frozen butter chunks and pulse until mixture is as described above. Then drizzle in the water while pulsing the processor. Turn the mixture out to a bowl and stir together thoroughly. Evenly press ¾ of the mixture into the ungreased 9-inch square pan. Scatter berries in one even layer over the pastry base. Top the berries with remaining pastry mixture. Bake on middle rack of preheated 375-degree F oven 30-35 minutes or until pastry is golden. Cool completely (at least 1 hour) before cutting into 12 blueberry bars.

*If using salted butter, decrease salt to ¼ teaspoon.
