Our mission is to enable the senior citizens of North Tillamook County to continue living independently in their own homes by providing access to nutritious meals and social occasions.



Meals for Seniors, Inc.



OVERVIEW: There are senior citizens in our communities who do not know where their next meal is coming from; or who must make a choice whether to buy food or pay a Medical bill. No senior should go to bed hungry. We can be there for

these seniors, but only with your help. Meals for Seniors, Inc. cooks, serves and delivers fresh, hot meals to senior citizens. We serve meals Monday, Wednesday and Friday at 11:30 am, 52 weeks of the year at the dining facility at St. Mary by the Sea Church in Rockaway Beach. Between Garibaldi and Nehalem, we also deliver meals to home bound seniors. For the home bound we deliver 6 meals per week, plus snacks. We are a volunteer managed and operated organization; funding for our program comes from donations and grants. In 2024 we are on track to prepare 14,000 meals!

Mission Statement:

Delivering compassionate team-based health care and wellness education to improve the lives of ALL in our community.

About Nehalem Bay Health Center & Pharmacy:

Nehalem Bay Health Center & Pharmacy is a non-profit Community Health Center on the North Oregon Coast that provides quality team-based health care services to the entire community, regardless of a person’s financial circumstances.

Nehalem Bay Health Center’s services include primary care for the whole family, naturopathic medicine, acupuncture, mental health counseling, well-child exams, women’s health, immunizations, on-site lab services, addiction counseling, 24-hour on-call availability, patient transportation, and health insurance assistance, in addition to wellness classes and activities that are free and open to the community. Several team members are bilingual (English/Spanish), and professional interpreter services are available for anyone who needs language access assistance. There is also an on-site pharmacy for the convenience of patients and the community.

Nehalem Bay Health Center also operates the Neah-Kah-Nie (NKN) Student Health & Wellness Center, a school-based health center located at NKN High School that serves students and staff within the NKN School District.

Nehalem Bay Health Center & Pharmacy accepts insurance, including the Oregon Health Plan, Medicare, and most private health insurance plans. A sliding fee scale is available to all patients based on income and, as a Federally Qualified Health Center, there are programs available to help patients who may have difficulty paying their health care bills.

In May of 2023, Nehalem Bay Health District voters approved a bond measure that is helping fund a new, larger, updated building that will house Nehalem Bay Health Center & Pharmacy on property owned by the health district in Wheeler, Oregon. The project broke ground in July, 2024 and the new, expanded Nehalem Bay Health Center & Pharmacy is expected to open in fall of 2025.

As a non-profit Community Health Center, Nehalem Bay Health Center & Pharmacy depends on a variety of funding, including federal and other grants. The center is also grateful for the generosity of private donors who help offset the cost of providing services to those in our community who need care.

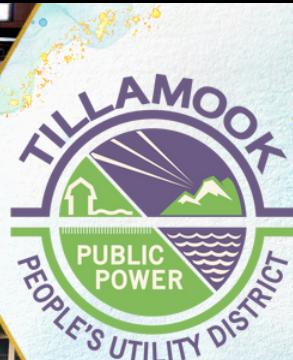

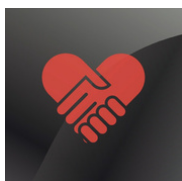

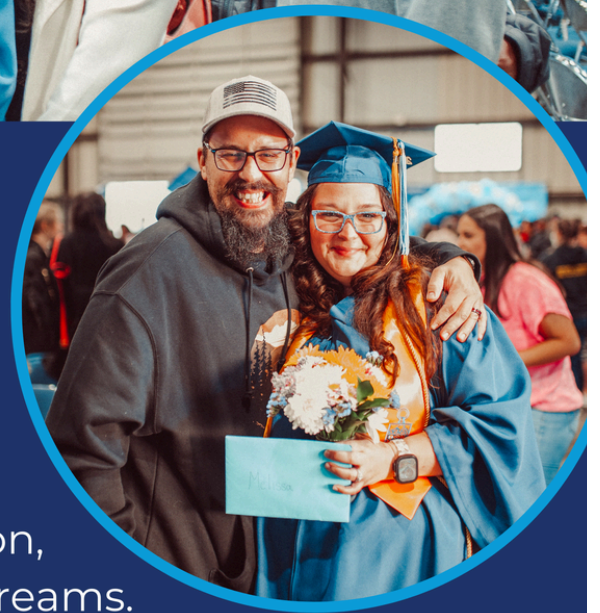
